

Stories for Life

We live in a broken and crazy society, and we need wisdom to navigate it well. Jesus is a tremendous source of wisdom, which we can glean from his life and teachings. One portion of his teachings that really focuses on biblical wisdom is the parables. As Jesus told stories, he did so with a purpose; he did so with intentionality. To capture this wisdom and apply it to our lives, we are going to be studying most of the parables of Jesus. This study and prayer guide is designed to help you study and meditate on the parables and other biblical passages that convey similar themes, and it will also assist you in praying in response to God's truth.

Each Sunday, our sermon will be focused on one of the parables of Jesus. During the week leading up to that Sunday sermon, this guide will focus on that parable for three days (Monday, Wednesday, & Friday), and on the other three days (Tuesday, Thursday, & Saturday) it will focus on passages that convey very similar messages. So you will be learning from the parable as well as related Scripture. The guide will also help you pray in response to Scripture. During this series, we are encouraging everyone to pray for the entire Harvest church family, and each day some will be listed. Our missionaries are included in this alphabetical list and are marked by an asterisk (*). As you pray for Harvesters, we encourage you to shape your prayers around the biblical text we are focusing on that day, resulting in more opportunities to pray biblically. In *this* guide, unlike the last one, we are not providing sample biblical prayers—hopefully you will find joy and blessing in creating them yourself along the way.

You will notice that the questions are different on the "parable" days and the "non-parable" days—stay on your toes! Most of the parables stress one major point, and it would be good for you to study and think and pray about what that point is, as well as how it impacts your life. Indeed, Jesus told these stories FOR LIFE.

— THE PARABLE OF THE ——

This parable gives the purpose of the parables and stresses that those who TRULY hear and understand God's Word will bear fruit.

MATTHEW 13:3-23

³Then he told them many things in parables, saying: "A farmer went out to sow his seed. ⁴ As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. ⁵ Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. ⁶ But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. ⁷ Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. ⁸ Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. ⁹ Whoever has ears, let them hear."

THE PARABLE OF THE -



This parable speaks of the separation of believers and unbelievers that will occur at the End of the world.

MATTHEW 13:24-30; 36-43

²⁴ Jesus told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a man who sowed good seed in his field. ²⁵ But while everyone was sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and went away. ²⁶ When the wheat sprouted and formed heads, then the weeds also appeared. ²⁷ "The owner's servants came to him and said, 'Sir, didn't you sow good seed in your field? Where then did the weeds come from?' ²⁸ "'An enemy did this,' he replied. "The servants asked him, 'Do you want us to go and pull them up?' ²⁹ "'No,' he answered, 'because while you are pulling the weeds, you may uproot the wheat with them. ³⁰ Let both grow together until the harvest. At that time I will tell the harvesters: First collect the weeds and tie them in bundles to be burned; then gather the wheat and bring it into my barn.'"



MATTHEW 13:31-35

³¹ He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his field. ³² Though it is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it grows, it is the largest of garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds come and perch in its branches." ³³ He told them still another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed into about sixty pounds of flour until it worked all through the dough."
³⁴ Jesus spoke all these things to the crowd in parables; he did not say anything to them without using a parable. ³⁵ So was fulfilled what was spoken through the prophet: "I will open my mouth in parables, I will utter things hidden since the creation of the world."

Note: For this week only, the biblical passages for Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday relate to the Lord's Supper to help prepare us for Communion next Sunday.





The first two parables relay the incredible value of the kingdom of heaven, making it worthwhile to give everything for it. The parable of the Net describes the state of the kingdom when the Last Judgment comes, once again picturing the separation of the saved and the lost.

MATTHEW 13:44-52

⁴⁴ "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field. ⁴⁵ "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. ⁴⁶ When he found one of great value, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it. ⁴⁷ "Once again, the kingdom of heaven is like a net that was let down into the lake and caught all kinds of fish. ⁴⁸ When it was full, the fishermen pulled it up on the shore. Then they sat down and collected the good fish in baskets, but threw the bad away. ⁴⁹ This is how it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come and separate the wicked from the righteous ⁵⁰ and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. ⁵¹ "Have you understood all these things?" Jesus asked. "Yes," they replied. ⁵² He said to them, "Therefore every teacher of the law who has become a disciple in the kingdom of heaven is like the owner of a house who brings out of his storeroom new treasures as well as old."


